September is upon us. Many of us, young and old, will be going back to school this month. My son, Sho, will be in his last year of middle school. My younger son, Ren, will be in second grade. My wife, Kyoko, may be doing some specialized studies in Waldorf educational programs. I can't spare the time for classroom studies, but I may break out that set of DVD's on Beethoven's quartets again. About a year ago I was listening to the fifth section of that course and Sho asked me, “Do you understand this?” My answer was, “In part”.

It is great that we study to be productive in life. It is pretty cool that older guys like me still study to enhance our lives. Still, to borrow a phrase from a deceased talk-show host, “This is not a dress rehearsal. This is your real life!” In other words, there is only so much time.

Most of you know that I have odd tastes in movies. I have lent some of you DVD's of “Serenity” only to have it returned with a “Too violent to watch” response. I've lent some of you my favorite comedy, “Hamlet 2”, only to have it returned with a response “In parts it was sort of funny”. Please come and hear Rev. Henry Adams first Dharma messages at the Oregon Buddhist Temple on the 23rd of this month. As the famous Japanese saying, Ichi Go Ichi E, reminds us each meeting with another person is unique and unrepeatable. In other words, there is only so much time.
