## Trusting-Confidence and Gratitude

The first Jodo Shinshu Dharma-message I heard was from the late Rev. Newton Ishiura. That was 31 years ago. He spoke about the saying of Nembutsu as an expression of gratitude based on

faith. I was knocked out. This resolved all the problems I had been having with a Soto Zen approach to Buddhist living. Dogen had discouraged “gaining ideas” in Zen practice. Here, in Jodo Shinshu, I felt I had the way out of the intellectual trap: practice in gratitude. Whatever devotional, meditative, non-meditative activities we engage in as Buddhists, just act in thankfulness.

Several decades earlier, still new to Jodo Shinshu tradition, I didn’t realize that “trust in the compassion of the Buddha and say the name in gratitude” was the most standard of all Jodo Shinshu Dharma messages. It was old hat to most people at the Fresno Betsuin in March of 1983, but it was new to me in my, then, 15 year-long study and practice of Buddhist spirituality.

I am reminded of one of the stories about Asahara Saichi. He had been at the temple with other lay people for a special observation and the fukukyoshi/guest minister gave a long, and by most accounts, tedious sermon. Walking out of the hondo/main chapel, one of the other members said to him, “That was an awful talk!” Saichi replied, “Oh no, it was a wonderful talk. At the end, he said ‘Namo Amida Butsu’.” Even if a Dharma-message is standard, or tedious, there are some for who it may open out a path to illumination, to composure, to Awakening.

I hope that some of you are finding my Dharma-messages valuable, even if it is only for the saying of the nembutsu in their concluding moments. At the General Membership meeting on 2-2-14 you will all have your chance to tell the Board of Trustees and I how you feel about the job we are doing. Come and let us hear what you have to say. The weekend after that we will not have a Sunday service at the temple since we will be at the Airport Sheraton, here in Portland, hosting the 67th Northwest District Buddhist Convention. I would like to thank all of you who have been involved in the planning of that event. It should be a wonderful weekend.

It is not only in our services, at special events and at our study classes that we find the opportunity to hear the Dharma. When our hearts are open, the Buddha-dharma can be heard in the giggle of a toddler, in the purring of a cat, in the way the breeze sounds moving through the trees. I hope that we will all hear the Dharma speaking to us in many ways this month. Although it may be a little chilly still this month, the lovely Northwest Spring is coming soon. Besides more enjoyable weather, who knows what wonderful surprises may be coming our way in future weeks. If we keep our eyes open we may find much to be thankful for in this still rather new year. If we keep our hearts open we may be able to live the Jodo Shinshu Buddhist way, - we may be able to live gratefully day after day. Perhaps this year I will come to fully understand that simple message I first heard from the late Rev. Newton Ishiura. Thank you for thinking through these things with me. I hope I will meet with each of you, many times this year. I am grateful for your support. I am thankful for the many good friends my wife and boys and I have made here in this community.

This past November, they were able to purchase a building (on a short sale) but it is just a 4,800 sq. ft. “shell”. Their goal for 2014 is raise the \$100,000+, complete all of the interior finish work, and move into a place that they can call their home.

We are busily planning for hospitality, logistics, and such for this annual event, which is part religious seminar, part reunion, part “night out,” and with some administrative meetings thrown in (and not necessarily in that order). It is an opportunity to meet with members of other temples, which is fun for those of us who like to socialize and finally hear and meet Rev. Dr. Jeff Wilson, our keynote speaker.

We will have workshops with our Northwest ministers, Rev. Ogui (in Japanese and English), Rev. Kakihara (in Japanese and English), Rev. Fujimoto, Rimban Castro, and Rev. Gibbs. Other workshops include a new song workshop with Etsu Osaki, a “deep” chanting workshop, yoga, taichi, one on Shoe Box Plays with Angie Hughes, and another about the meaning of Bon Odori (dance) with Sahomi Tachibana. Other activities will be a Silent Auction, the BCA Bookstore, and an IPOD mini raffle to benefit the Las Vegas Buddhist Temple building project, sponsored by OBT. ## New Book in the Library

Experimental Buddhism: Innovation and Activism in Contemporary Japan by John K. Nelson, Univ of Hawaii Press, Honolulu, 2013, 203 pages.

The author is a professor in the Department of Theology and Religious Studies at the University of San Francisco.

A most interesting chapter is about Rev. Akari Miura, a woman Jodoshinshu minister in Japan who heads a temple of 250 families. It tells how she uses music to enhance her work. She was playing the piano at four, the electric guitar at 12 and later composing and playing rock music in her own band. She says, "I want temples to be a place where people can meet and create new communities of shared interests, and where they can go to enjoy themselves."
