He was still single when he arrived after serving at the Seattle Betsuin and officiated at the dedication of our current temple building in November 1966. A year later his wedding to Hiroko took place in the new temple. Although his English was halting, because of his gentle demeanor, he was loved by young and old alike. He served San Francisco Temple on leaving Portland and then returned to his family temple in Japan. Word was received from the Hongwanji International Department that Sensei passed away on 8/27/2015 in Shiga, at the age of 87. He is survived by his wife, Hiroko, and an adopted son, who continues in his father's place.

President's message

Dear Sangha Members, Many of you have heard "bits and pieces" and rumors about Portland Taiko (PT) moving into OBT. To avoid further speculation I'd like to "officially" share some of the discussions in regards to Portland

Taiko's proposal. First, a formal rental or lease agreement has yet to be made/signed. In August the Board unanimously agreed to "pursue" this proposal. By doing so it enabled PT and OBT to proceed with investigating the feasibility and details of an arrangement that works for both parties. If and when a formal lease agreement is created, it will be presented to the Board for approval.

There are many positive benefits to leasing space to Portland Taiko. Just to mention a few: a) Security: Increased presence and foot traffic in the annex and temple can be a deterrent to crime and unwanted visitors b) Financially provide a steady monthly income not related to fund raising c) A complimentary performance at Obon d) Continue a

positive relationship with both cultural and performing arts communities.

Right now we are determining if we can meet their needs which include: a) Use of the basement for rehearsals and lessons primarily on weeknights b) Office space (a room in the annex) c) Half of the garage and d) Storage space in the basement for practice equipment.

Like all OBT rentals, Portland Taiko understands that when necessary, temple events and needs will be come first. For example they would not use the basement on Friday or Saturday when we are preparing for the Sukiyaki dinner or need to conduct a funeral.

Several volunteers are and have been reorganizing and cleaning up spaces in the temple and annex. Not only is this general clean up and reorganization long overdue, it also enables us to create the space that PT is hoping we can provide. I'm confident that OBT can have a professional, trusting and comfortable relationship with Wynn Kiyama, the Executive Director of Portland Taiko and incidentally an active temple member.

This is a brief summary of the details so far. We are trying to be very thoughtful, thorough, and are making an effort to foresee any issues that might arise. We're looking forward to our next campout in October where the girls will learn camping skills or improve what they've learned before.




