Minister's Corner Phaedra Urban OBT Board



Introduction to Reverend Joshin **Dennis Fujimoto:** Reverend Joshin Dennis Fujimoto was born in Tokvo. Japan in 1952. His family moved to the United

States in 1953. He received his MA from the Institute of Buddhist Studies in Berkeley, California in

1980. Reverend Fujimoto is currently the resident minister of the Idaho-Oregon Buddhist Temple in Ontario where he is serving his 10th year. His initial ordination of Tokudo was received in 1981. His Kyoshi ordination as teacher was received in Kyoto, Japan in 2004.

At the beginning of January, board members had the opportunity to meet with Reverend Fujimoto who will be acting as supervising minister of the Oregon Buddhist Temple until a resident minister is installed. Reverend Fujimoto's home temple is in the Idaho-Oregon temple in Ontario where he has been serving for nearly a decade. The Sangha of the Idaho-Oregon temple extends far beyond the borders of the town however. In fact, it is so large, Reverend Fujimoto shared, that sometimes there are so many services that it takes three days to cover. Reverend Fujimoto is a sculptor and founded Sangha Taiko. Both his father and brother were ordained as Jodo Shinshu ministers. His wife Sharmon is a minister's assistant. His dharma talks are thoughtful, creative, and punctuated with a dry sense of humor. We are looking forward to his guidance and insights during the upcoming months.

During our meetings, Reverend Fujimoto identified a series of dates for monthly visits to the temple through June. During nearly all visits, Rev. Fujimoto will attend to ministerial duties over two days. Typically, he will arrive in the late morning on Saturdays and depart in the early evening on Sundays.

In addition to Sunday services, Dharma School, and Dharma Exchange, Reverend Fujimoto will be available to temple members who are homebound, as well as home visitations by members looking to connect or just for a casual meeting with temple members. Reverend Fujimoto will have access to the temple vehicle for transportation. In the case of unexpected needs, illness or death, Reverend Fujimoto has expressed that despite his busy schedule, he is committed to serving the OBT Sangha as his schedule allows during intermediate times. Temple members are encouraged to connect with Reverend Fujimoto when he is needed through board president Cathy Yarne by emailing president@oregonbuddhisttemple.com or leaving a message at (503) 234-9456. Advanced scheduling for home visits is available.

Reverend Fujimoto's schedule includes the following dates and special services:

- January 17th and 18th (Sangha-minister meet and greet)
- February 8th (Nirvana Day Pet Memorial)
- March 14th and 15th (Ohigan) April 18th and 19th (Hanamatsuri) May 23rd and 24th (Gotan-e)
- June 13th and 14th

The board extends its gratitude to Reverend Fujimoto and to the ID-OR and our Sanghas for their generous accommodations, flexibility, and understanding during this time of transition. They, along with other volunteers, and Rev. Fujimoto are committing themselves so we'll continue to have regular services, Dharma School and Dharma Exchange.

Even though it's been barely a month since I officially joined the Board, I've been so impressed with the services, Dharma talks, events and positive energy at the Temple. Life moves on and so will the Oregon Buddhist Temple. If you take the time to reflect on what the Temple means to you, I hope you'll be willing to step up to help build our Sangha and "move forward" with us. Cathy

Don't forget the OBWA New Year party on January 31 at 10 am at Holladay Park Plaza. Bring a canned food donation and a wrapped white elephant gift.



OBT January Board Meeting Summary

On January 9th 2015, eight board members and OBWA co-president June Shiigi met for the first general board meeting of the year.

Ray Fukunaga has been gathering maintenance information including repair and maintenance of the elevator and HVAC systems in the kitchen. Because of these commitments, it was decided to have new board member Phaedra Urban act as board secretary until the return of Angie Hughes this spring. She will provide board meeting summaries for each newsletter for the Sangha.

The meeting began with a financial report submitted by Elaine Yuzuriha.

Weekly coverage of the temple office was identified by president Cathy Yarne. (Please call before stopping by to ensure someone will be available to help you.)

There are no further updates in the search for a new minister. A committee lead by Yoshi Ono will represent the temple in the initial phase with later incorporation of a broader group. Rev. Dennis Fujimoto will coordinate with the bishop the agreement between the temples as he provides ministerial support and supervision to the minister's assistants.

Monthly reports were provided by the temple groups and committees. Dharma school is meeting as a whole in the Mabel Boggs room. OBWA is planning a New Year's party at the end of the month at the Holladay Park Plaza from 10am to 2pm.

OBT Mochitsuki and New Year's luncheon were both successful in meeting goals - both financial and in community spirit.

Amy Peterson reviewed security procedures and safeguards for the temple and annex. *Upcoming convention attendance reviewed. No need for transportation from the temple identified. *Current facilities rentals were reviewed. New guidelines and agreement are available and to be implemented across all renters in the New Year. *Committee chairs for upcoming events were reviewed with the exception of Sukiyaki and Toban Coordinator – (volunteers for these positions are welcome).* Obon promotion by Phaedra Urban is underway. It was determined that an Obon website in coordination with the temple website would assist traditional marketing efforts. Obon co-chairs are Craig Yanase, Judy Hittle and Charles Reneau. *Al Ono is leading the membership drive. Membership is \$250 for the year and may be broken into payments over the year.
